So we calculate the profit now Mr Paspal Singh earn around by selling both milk of cow and buffalo from 1.8 lakh to 2lakhsper month.

Feed cost of buffalo = 1200-1500*30days = 38000 to 40000 approx per month Veterinary cost of buffalo = 1300-1600*9=14000 approx per month

Feed cost of cow = 1000- 1300 *30 days = 32000 to 34000 approx per month Veterinary cost of cow =1100-1400*4=5000 approx per month

Miscellaneous cost of both = 5000 approx per month Total expenditure= 1 lakh approx per month Total profit=80000-100000approx per month
